The UNLV Foundation has become fully operational. It has been incorporated within the State of Nevada and on Wednesday, November 4, 1981, held its formal organizational meeting and election of officers. Members of the Board are actively participating in the process of identifying prospects, and in addition, attending to the operations of the UNLV Foundation as their duties would suggest.
