The Foundation is serving as the primary entity charged with soliciting and successfully acquiring resources in support of UNLV and its academic and research programs. Continuous fund raising programs will be carried out in coordination with UNLV's Development Office. Included in those specific activities which have already been identified to be carried out by the Foundation are the following.

- a. Annual Giving Program directed to all alumni and friends; b. Major Donor Programs (President's Associates and Corporate Support); c. Deferred Giving Programs directed to all alumni and friends; and d. Capital and Special purpose programs as needed

In order to provide an additional mechanism through which alumni and other friends co-actively support UNLV, the UNLV Foundation, under the direction of eighteen volunteer trustees has been organized. The UNLV Foundation has become fully operational. It has been incorporated within the State of Nevada and on Wednesday, November 4, 1981, held its formal organizational meeting and election of officers. Members of the Board are actively participating in the process of identifying prospects, and in addition, attending to the operations of the UNLV Foundation as their duties would suggest.

The specific activities which the UNLV Foundation plan to undertake include the following:

- (a). Assisiting faculty and staff on campus in identifying potential sources of support;
- (b). Assisitng prospective donors in determing how they might most appropriately make their gifts to UNLV
- (c). Providing prospective and current donors with detailed information about the needs of UNLV and how they maight take a more active role in fulfilling such needs, and;
- (d). Providing advice and counsel to the President of UNLV and other members of the administrative staff on what needs might realistically be fulfilled through the efforts of the Foundation.

As the Foundation grows and becomes more proficient in attracting donors, its services will expand to meet the needs of those who may be considering current or planned gifts in support of an area of specific interest.

Duties: The Treasurer shall be the principal finance officer of the corporation; shall have the charge and custody of and be responsible for all funds and securities of the corporation; shall deposit such funds in the name of the corporation in such depositories as shall be designated by the Board of Trustees, shall keep accurate books of accounts and records of financial transactions and the condition of the corporation; and shall submit such reports thereof as the Board of Trustees may from time to time require; and, in general, perform all duties incident to such office and such other duties as may from time to time be assigned to such person by the Chairman or by the Board of Trustees. The Treasurer shall make an annual written financial report to the corporation at the annual meeting of the Board of Trustees. With the approval of the Board of Trustees, the Treasurer shall be authorized to engage any firm of certified public accountants to assist the Treasurer in the performance of any of the duties incident to the office.
